OUR USE CASE:

Get data into Drupal
and reduce the time spent
on content entry

Why use the Migrate API?

- 1. Data is usually interconnected with references**
- 2. I'm usually loading the site with many types of content at the same time**
- 3. Built in system for tracking which content is new and which is updated**
- 4. Built in system for rolling back (deleting) content**
- 5. Can be used once and then removed without causing a problem**
- 6. Can use migration map table as reverse lookup for Drupal nid/tid**

When are migrations a good fit? Or when are migrations a bad fit?

Points to consider:

- **Level of effort vs other data entry methods**
- **Does the data have a fixed pattern?**
- **Do you need real time data?**

Other potential pitfalls:

- **Migrating content with lots of references from spreadsheets can be trouble**
- **Migrating WYSIWYG fields can be problematic because of special codes**
- **Need to write code**

CONTRIB MODULES

Drupal Core's Migrate Module

- Contains the base functionality for migrations

Migrate Plus (https://www.drupal.org/project/migrate_plus)

- Allows import/export of migration config as yml
- Allows migrations from apis and files (xml, json, etc)

Migrate Tools (https://www.drupal.org/project/migrate_tools)

- Provides additional drush integration
- Provides a --sync option when running migrations
- Provides the MigrateExecutable class that lets us run migrations in code

Migrate Source CSV (https://www.drupal.org/project/migrate_source_csv)

- Provides a CSV source plugin

DRUSH COMMANDS

Drush Commands

drush ms

- Lists your migrations and their status

drush mim migration_name

- Import the migration
- Useful flags are --group, --limit, --idlist, --update, --execute-dependencies

drush mr migration_name

- Rollback (delete) all content created previously

drush mrs migration_name

- Reset a migration to idle

drush mmsg migration_name

- Shows messages when a migration encounters a problem

CREATING MIGRATIONS

Extract - Transform - Load (ETL)



Migration Demo

Parks Migration

- Node migration from JSON API
- Custom source plugin which calls secondary api to load additional data

Staff Migration

- Node migration from CSV with linked migrations to create media and file entities
- Custom process plugin to only migrate value if field is empty

Ratings Migration

- Taxonomy migration from CSV linked to Movies migration

Movies Migration

- Node migration from JSON API
- Custom Migrate Plus fetcher plugin which allows dynamic filtering
- Prepare row hook to dynamically set field value


